Year 3BH— Thursday and Friday.



# **Religious Education**

In Come & See we will be following the topics 'Homes', 'Promises' and 'Visitors'.

During these topics, children will have the opportunity to explore Bible Scriptures and make links between these and their own lives as well as giving reasons for their actions. And the actions of Christians in our community

Class liturgies take place every other Friday, in which the children will prepare in groups.

Please look at The Word of the Week clips as a family.

### **English & Mathematics**

In English this term the children will be investigating a range of different text types, including setting and character description, historical stories, non-fiction text and stories with a familiar setting. Within each unit the children will study a variety of different skills. Each unit will end with an opportunity to produce a piece of independent extended writing. There will also be specific grammar sessions and Active English sessions in order to develop and practise the children's understanding of the structure of the English language. Separate to the English lessons, the children will also be taught through whole class guided reading sessions. Our spelling objectives will be met through the teaching of the RWI Get Spelling Programme in Key Stage 2. The children will take part in daily Maths sessions, which will develop their mental and written maths skills. Each unit will provide many varied opportunities provided to extend their knowledge. Children will be given the chance to explore 'real-life' problem solving and develop their mathematical reasoning skills throughout their work. The children will be taught a range of arithmetic strategies including using times tables up to 12x12.

#### **Curriculum Focus**

Throughout the Advent term, in Geography we will be finding out about where be belong and land use within the local area and in Science we will be answering the questions 'How does a shadow change?' and 'does a larger magnet have a larger magnetic force?'. This term's Art is all about the first art, including cave paintings and the Stone Age. History will be focused on the changes between the Stone Age and the Iron Age. In DT, we will design and make a magnetic toy. Computing we will be revisiting digital literacy and e-safety and we will be composing music in our Music sessions. We will also participate in French and PSHE lessons.

## **Physical Education**

Our PE this term is hockey, gymnastics, dance/yoga and handball.

#### **PSHE/British Values**

In our PSHE lessons, we will be focusing on 'family, belonging and loving'.
