Holy Trinity has a bright, dynamic and inclusive learning environment, with large airy classrooms and a variety of additional learning spaces, including a library, ICT suite, school hall and chapel.

We are passionate about learning outdoors and the benefits that working outside has on children's learning outcomes and their mental health and well-being. We have a wonderful, well-cared-for outdoor learning space, including a large field, designated sports pitches, a range of outdoor climbing and gym equipment, a trim trail and an award-winning school garden and allotment area where we grow our own produce.

We also have a large Forest School area known as 'Ecoland' incorporating a bright, outdoor classroom, toilet, seating area, pond, mud kitchen, meadow area and bird hide. All children have weekly Forest School sessions, throughout the year, which are incorporated into our main curriculum.

We believe that spending time outdoors not only provides health benefits but also improves children's communication and language skills, self-esteem and confidence as well as encouraging positive, personal and social development – all of which we place great value upon at Holy Trinity.

## Our curriculum

At Holy Trinity, we are very proud of our exciting, knowledge and vocabulary-rich curriculum, which is carefully planned so that children build on their prior knowledge and remember more over time.

We follow the EYFS curriculum and National Curriculum for KS1 and KS2, and this is rooted in our school virtues of respect, reconciliation, resilience, care, compassion and courage.

Our curriculum promotes strong communication, language and vocabulary development, widens children's knowledge and skills and broadens their aspirations for the future.

Our curriculum is deliberately planned to enhance links with the local community and uses Newark's various historical sites to develop children's understanding of its place in shaping history. It is also planned to develop an understanding of the wider world and the impact that we have as global citizens, enhanced through our weekly Forest School provision and Eco School curriculum.

Our children talk confidently and articulately about their learning – they love to share new knowledge, vocabulary and interesting facts! To achieve this, teachers ensure that every subject is exciting and relevant.

Teachers use a variety of strategies to check how well children have remembered what they have learnt; they assess pupil progress regularly and provide a range of interventions to support those who need it.

At Holy Trinity, we encourage independence in learning. Our children particularly enjoy quizzing using iPads and like to see their scores for themselves, finding out where they have done well and where they need to improve.

Each class also benefits from a teaching assistant who provides support within the classroom to small groups or on an individual basis where needed. This ensures that children have a good understanding and are ready for the next lesson.







The Catholic Social Teaching principles, our school virtues, our school Mission Statement, (In every child there is a space that only God can fill) and our Collective Worship and personal prayer programme form the foundations of everything that we do at Holy Trinity.

Collective Worship takes place daily either with the whole school, in key stages or at the classroom level. We value pupil ownership of the Catholic Life and Mission of our school and from a very young age, our children take responsibility for planning and leading acts of worship. Our School Chapel is used regularly throughout the week for personal and small-group prayer opportunities, and this is highly valued by the children.

This along with the British values of life and dignity of the human person, promotion of peace, economic justice, democracy, mutual respect, acceptance of different cultures and religions and individual liberty therefore underpin every aspect of school life.

Our school virtues are: Respect, Reconciliation, Resilience, Care, Compassion and Courage.

As well as our weekly Forest School sessions, being located directly next to Sconce Park, we benefit from a close working relationship with the Park Rangers and take part in various outdoor activities on the park and in the Willow Holt. We have a dynamic Eco and Gardening Team, and our school garden has won numerous Newark in Bloom awards over the years, as well as their work contributing to achieving Cafod's Live Simply Award and the Eco Schools Green Flag Award with Merit.

We offer a wider range of educational visits throughout the year, both locally and further afield including three residential opportunities to either Sherwood Forest or Castleton in Year 2, PGL in Year 4 and the Briars in Year 6.

At Holy Trinity, we are passionate about the Performing Arts and ensure that each child has an opportunity within each phase to perform on stage for an audience. This begins in EYFS and KS1 with the Nativity Play, the Easter Production in Y3/4 and an End of Year Production in Y5/6. This encourages their confidence and self-esteem and allows children to shine!

We also love music and really enjoy singing. As well as our uplifting weekly singing sessions, we also hold termly music concerts where children perform the pieces of music learnt in their whole class music tuition; and soloist children who have individual tuition also perform along with our vibrant school band.

We offer both a breakfast and an after-school club five days a week. We also offer a wide range of after-school and lunchtime clubs including football, cricket, rounders, netball, sewing, jigsaw, Irish dancing, Magical Maths, doodle club and chess club. We also participate in the Newark Schools' Chess Tournament and won in 2019!

#### **Achieving full potential**

We are passionate about being a highly inclusive school and celebrate all children's achievements and successes, both in and out of school. We have high aspirations for our children's achievements and behaviour and we monitor progress regularly throughout the year to ensure that they have every chance of achieving well. We liaise with external agencies to ensure that additional support is available to those who need it.

We pride ourselves on being an attachment and trauma-informed school; all staff are trained in emotional coaching strategies to support children's self-regulation and we employ two highly trained Emotional Literacy Support Assistants who provide bespoke pastoral support.

#### **Opportunities for personal development**

Inspired by our ultimate goal of encouraging our children to be good citizens of the future and having the courage to do the right thing and make a difference in the world, we ensure that each and every child is provided with rich opportunities to achieve their full potential. This includes encouraging children to become actively involved in a variety of leadership and stewardship roles, engendering not only a sense of responsibility but also building their confidence and self-esteem and allowing them to have a voice.

We provide a variety of ambassador roles for the children to develop their skills: School Council, Chaplaincy Team, Peer Mentors, Respect Rangers, Eco and Gardening Team, Agents for Change, Take 5 Ambassadors, International Ambassadors, House Captains and Playground Leaders and buddies.

We also value the opportunity for our children to take part in fundraising activities and support those less fortunate; we support a range of charities local to Newark as well as national and international charities.

We enjoy a strong relationship with Holy Trinity parish – our children regularly lead the readings and prayers at Sunday Masses. At Christmas time they make cards for the sick and housebound members of our parish community as well as those in local care homes and hospitals.





#### **Our community**

It is a privilege to be chosen by families to have their children entrusted to our care and we pride ourselves on securing a positive relationship with parents and carers as their child's first educators.

We invite parents to celebration assemblies, acts of worship and retreat days, as well as sports days, Nativity and Easter plays and end-of-year productions.

We use Class Dojo as a communication tool. This allows us to send whole school, class and individual messages and gives parents and carers the opportunity to message staff directly.

We set homework and photos of children's achievements using this facility so that parents feel part of their child's journey. We also use Facebook and Twitter to post photographs and help parents feel involved.

#### **Joining Holy Trinity**

Admissions to Holy Trinity are coordinated by Nottinghamshire County Council, with all decisions relating to admission applications being taken by the school's Local Governing Body.

Applications for first admissions are made on the Common Application Form provided by the Local Authority. Further information can be found on the Nottinghamshire County Council Website. An application can be made at any time outside the normal admission round and the child will be admitted where there are spaces available.

If applying for a place on faith grounds, a Supplementary Form should be completed and returned to the school office. These can be found on the school website.

Where there are places available but more applications than places, the published oversubscription criteria will be applied.
