Lent at Holy Trinity

The three Lenten themes of Prayer, Fasting and Almsgiving have had focus in school over the past few weeks. Lent began on Ash Wednesday, where KS2 attended a special Mass and received ashes on their foreheads. EYFS and KS1 had a special ashes service led by Fr Michael in the afternoon. During our Celebrations of the Word we have reflected on all the different ways to pray; we have together created a whole school prayer reflecting on what we can 'fast on or feast on' during Lent. We also discussed similarities between Christianity and Islam, making connections with fasting that some of our Muslim friends were taking part in during Ramadam. We have also learnt more about and prayed for the work of the various different charities that we support. KS2 children took part in the Big Lent Walk around Sconce Park, raising money for Cafod and the YMCA's homelessness appeal. This week Y3 and Y4 children have presented a beautiful Easter Play sharing the important message of Jesus' sacrifice on the cross on Good Friday and the Good News of his Resurrection at Easter. We will end the week with a Holy Week Retreat Day, with Prayer Stations and outdoor stations of the cross led by the Chaplaincy Team, an opportunity for KS2 children to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and take part in Adoration; and on Friday we end with a special Stations of the Cross and Crucifixion service led by our Y5/6 children - all welcome 10:30am in church.

St Patrick's and St Joseph's Day

We celebrated a Whole School Mass for St Patrick and St Joseph on Thursday 20th March led by KS1 children. This was the first time that our younger children have led the readings at Mass this year and they did so wonderfully well, thanks to the preparation from their teachers. They reminded us of the example set by both of these great saints and encouraged us to follow the example that they set. As usual, the children were fantastically behaved in church and sang beautifully. Well done to all the children who took part!

School Uniform Reminders

Thank you for your support in helping us maintain high standards with our school uniform.
