Many thanks to all families who came along to support us and participate and for sending in flowers to mark this special event.




Attendance Continued...

Below is a break down of last half term's attendance. 95.4% is the National Average and we sit at **94% overall which is lower than National but improved since last term,** recognising the impact of last term's chickenpox outbreak in school. Last half term's attendance strongly improved and a significant number of children whose attendance was lower than 90% has now also significantly improved. Thank you parents and well done children!




Welcome Pope Leo!




VE Day Celebrations




FHT Updates

School Uniform Reminders

Thank you for your support in helping us maintain high standards with our school uniform.

These are our School Virtues, chosen by the children a few years ago, that underpin everything we do at Holy Trinity and form the 'Holy Trinity Way' which our whole staff have reviewed together this academic year. It's quite a long document but it maps out exactly how we all expect to treat one another and behave together in various different contexts so that each and every one is respected and valued, having been created in God's image and likeness.

Parts of this will be re-visited with the children at an age appropriate level over the course of the term and into next academic year.

Head Lice

Headlice is a frequent and ongoing problem in all schools. However, they can easily be prevented by being vigilant; checking your child's hair regularly, combing through conditioner onto 'nit-free' hair as a preventative, keeping long hair tied back; and when any headlice are spotted, treating immediately with the special medicated shampoo from the Pharmacist.

If everyone could do this, they are easily maintained and outbreaks are prevented. There is little more annoying than ongoing and reoccurring infestations for parents, children and staff alike.

So please, everyone, let's work together to remain vigilant, act quickly and prevent headlice from circulating!

School Garden update
